Over the years, I watched my mom serve Latino elders at the Haverhill Citizens Center by helping them find services and supports. Her contributions inspired me to want to serve my community as well.

I started my human service journey eight years ago working with families and individuals who live with a disability at an Independent Living Center in Lawrence. I began working in their PCA department before transferring to the Youth Services Department. I eventually managed that department and collaborated with various school districts to provide soft skills training to students with disabilities. These work experiences have allowed me the opportunity to learn some of the most valuable core principles that will forever be integrated in my moral compass.

And today, as a new mom to an amazing one year old girl, I hope to instill the values of self-worth, kindness and respect my mother instilled in me. I look forward to continuing to serve not only the disability community but the Latino community on this new journey with The Arc for many years to come.

### **AFC Connects**

## Do you or a loved one qualify for our Adult Family Care Program?

The AFC program is an Arc program funded by MassHealth that pays either family\* or non-family members a monthly tax-free stipend to care for people in a home setting who are age 16 and doler and who cannot live safely on their own. The goal of the program is to keep people living in a home setting.

### To qualify for AFC services, the member:

- Must have MassHealth (Standard or CommonHealth)
- Be 16 years or older; and have someone over the age of 18 acting as caregiver (cannot be spouse or guardian)
- Have one or more medical diagnosis;
- Require at least supervision throughout or physical assistance with one Activity of Daily Living (ADL), including: bathing, dressing, eating, transferring, or ambulating;
- Cannot be left alone in the home setting for more than 3 hours

\*Spouses and guardians may not become the AFC Member's caregiver.



### Benefits of joining the AFC Program:

- RN's and Care Coordinators offer ongoing education, advocacy, and healthcare oversight
- Non-taxable monetary support according to the needs of the individual cared for
- 24-hour emergency line
- Assistance with accessing community supports
- Bi-lingual (Spanish/English) Care Coordination and Nursing is available

### The Reality of COVID-19 for a Parent

As a parent of a child with developmental disabilities, I can tell you firsthand I have learned that it truly takes a village. My son Chris needs total care and cannot be left unattended, leaving me and my husband to take care of him 24/7. With limited support and an unfortunate workforce crisis we do not have much time for ourselves, to go on a date, or just go to the store alone. Finding a reliable Personal Care Assistant has been tough, and COVID-19 has been a big setback on this issue. As well as the shutdown of his day program, which at times was our only relief.

Chris' day program allows him to get out of the house and have a life of his own, as well as for us. In March 2020 when his day program shutdown due to COVID-19 I felt overwhelmed and left with little to no help. I am happy that after a long two and a half years his day program has finally opened back up and has given us some much-needed relief, although it was not an easy road. I am grateful for the reopening and am hopeful for the workforce crisis to change for the better. I know I am not the only parent out there going through this, but we must remain hopeful and pushing forward.

## Legislative Action Needed!

The Economic Development Bill

### New Workforce Action Alert: Contact Your Legislators About The Economic Development Bill

The Arc asks for 100% participation from all who care about the human services workforce! Please take 2 minutes to send this letter to your legislator. Funding for workforce rates, (Chapter 257) must be included in the Economic Development Bill, as it was at the end of this session.

The Senate version had \$150 million ANNUALIZED to help raise salaries. Both House and Senate versions had \$100 million one-time dollars as well. Our service delivery system is at RISK and we need both investments in the Economic Development Bill. It will make an impact on so many who continue to have unmet needs, or no program supports.
